Archdiocesan Strategic Planning Process

In a letter dated May 23rd, Archbishop Nienstedt outlined developments that are taking place in the planning process for the future of our archdiocese. The Strategic planning Task Force has been meeting for the past year to study the future make-up of our Archdiocesan parishes and schools. Recommendations will be given to the Archbishop this summer and a new strategic plan will be announced in the fall. The following timeline is being used as a guide:

Major themes of input from leadership, parishioners and Catholic school families include:

.Outreach: we recognize the need to reach out to young people, disaffected Catholics, new immigrants and the poor.

.Transparency: we recognize a need for more openness about parish and Archdiocesan finances and improved communication at all levels.

.Responsible stewardship: we recognize the need to make better use of the gifts we are given so all are served well and within our means.

.Collaboration: we recognize that fostering cooperation, communication and a shared commitment between parishes is important.

.Healthy and unhealthy competition: we recognize that parishes and schools often sense we are competing with one another and it's not always a good thing.

Next week we will relate why change is needed and the possible changes that are being discussed.
