Heart speaks to heart

Pope Benedict XVI will beatify John Henry Cardinal Newman this Sunday, September 19, 2010, during his visit to the United Kingdom. His motto was “cor ad cor loquitur”— *heart speaks to heart*. As we see the action of God’s grace in the lives of the saints, it reminds us of the transformation in love that God wants to accomplish in our hearts.

Blessed John Henry Newman is not to be confused with the American Saint John Neumann, a Redemptorist missionary from central Europe and eventually bishop of Philadelphia. University chaplaincies are often called a “Newman Center” in honor of this great English intellectual and convert of the 19th century. We pray that the newly beatified Cardinal Newman will continue to inspire college students and professors as they begin this academic year. We can all learn from his example of using the intellect to ponder mysteries of faith in rigorous dialogue with the world around him.

May this meditation of Blessed John Henry Newman be helpful to us as we reflect on call to serve God:

“God has created me to do him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which he has not committed to another. I have my mission; I never may know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. I have a part in a great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.”
